## Individual Reflection Questions

1. Read 1 Kings 18:1–2 and 18:17–19. Why do you think Ahab referred to Elijah as the “troubler of Israel”? What does this reveal about how those in power sometimes respond to truth-tellers?
2. In 1 Kings 18:21, Elijah asks, “How long will you waver between two opinions?”
  - What does this question reveal about the spiritual condition of Israel?
  - In what ways do we “waver” between following God and following the world today?
3. The prophets of Baal called out all day and even harmed themselves, but their god didn’t answer (vv. 26–29). What does this passage teach us about false gods and the futility of misplaced faith?
4. Read 1 Kings 18:36–39. How does Elijah’s simple prayer contrast with the frantic activity of the prophets of Baal? What does this tell us about faith and God’s power?
5. Nate said, “Faith stands firm—even when you’re the last one standing.”
  - Can you think of a time when you had to stand firm in your faith, even when it was unpopular or uncomfortable?
  - What was the result?
