3.	The Principle: Bring With You. God's calling on your life is bigger than your lifetime—so bring someone with you.	
	When you bring someone along, one of two things will happen:	

- 1. You'll be surprised—they'll rise to the challenge and thrive in ways you never expected.
- 2. Or they'll stumble—and grow through it. Because failure is one of God's favorite classrooms.

Weekly Application Step – Put Your Yes on the Table

Put your YES on the table.

Maybe you don't know what God's next assignment is—but you can decide your answer in advance.

"God, whatever You ask, wherever You lead—my yes is already on the table." Because the moment you put your yes on the table, God starts writing stories that outlast your lifetime.

Questions for Further Study

1.	Read Proverbs 16:9 and Romans 8:28. How do these verses shape the way you view delays, detours, or interruptions in your own life?
2.	Compare Luke 8:43–48 (the woman healed by touching Jesus) with Mark 10:46–52 (Bartimaeus calling out from the crowd).
	What similarities do you see in how Jesus responds to interruptions?
3.	Read John 11:1–44 (the raising of Lazarus). How does Jesus respond to Martha and Mary's grief when they think He's too late?
	How does this compare with His words to Jairus in Luke 8:50 ("Don't be afraid; just believe")?
4.	Look at 2 Timothy 2:2 — how does Paul describe this same pattern of passing on faith and ministry?
5.	What might it look like for you to leave a spiritual legacy — in your family, workplace, or community?
