Reminder #1: Contentment is Rooted in Christ, Not

Philippians 4:4–7

Contentment isn't discovered in a life without problems—
It's found in a life centered on Christ.

Reminder #2: Contentment is Learned Through Every

Philippians 4:10–12;13

If we don't learn contentment in less... we won't find it in more.

Reminder #3: Contentment is Expressed Through How We

Philippians 4:14-20

1. Contentment shows up in relationships (Philippians 4:2).
2. Contentment shows up in the way you think (Philippians 4:8).
3. Contentment shows up in generosity (Philippians 4:15-20).
