Questions for Further Study

3. How does Revelation 1:1–3 connect with Daniel 12:4–9, and what do the differences between “seal up” and “unveil” reveal about God’s timing and plan?
4. Compare Revelation 1:5–6 with Exodus 19:5–6 and 1 Peter 2:9—how does Jesus fulfill and expand the calling of God’s people as a kingdom of priests?
5. What parallels do you see between Revelation 1:7, Zechariah 12:10, and Matthew 24:30, and how do they deepen your understanding of Christ’s return?
